

DESCRIPTION:

Your doctor has prescribed a fecal CALPROTECTIN test. This test is used to detect the presence of a protein which can be a sign of Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis. The test is simple and quick to perform. In addition, no special diet is necessary.

TO KNOW:

Stools MUST NOT be in CONTACT with WATER, URINE or the TOILET bowl, contamination from this test will cause you to start the process all over again.

In addition, COLLECTION and RETURN must be done (*MONDAY – TUESDAY – WEDNESDAY*) **ONLY**. The laboratory WILL REFUSE all samples that are DONE and RETURNED on OTHER DAYS of the week.

SAMPLING:

- 1. Open your kit. (BIOHAZARD bag + STERILE container + spatula / tongue depressor)
- 2. Write CLEARLY your: LAST NAME, First Name / Date & Time (of collection) on the label of the container.
- 3. Urinate and completely empty your bladder. (Because stools MUST NOT be in CONTACT with WATER, URINE, or the TOILET bowl).
- 4. Defecate in a CLEAN container (aluminum plate). Discard once complete.
- 5. Using a spatula (tongue depressor / plastic spoon), put the equivalent of 1-2 tablespoons of your stool in the STERILE container.
- 6. Put the lid back on the container and seal tightly.
- 7. Return the container to the BIOHAZARD bag and close it tightly.
- 8. Wash your hands thoroughly.
- 9. Store the bag (with container) in the refrigerator (4*C).

ATTENTION:

You must bring or hand in your stool sample within 24 hours of collection and make sure to bring or have your REQUISITION and your RAMQ (*Health Insurance*) card, because the laboratory can REFUSE any samples NOT COMPLIANT with the instructions listed above.
